Dear Comptroller Dinapoli:

In accordance with the provisions of Section 170 of the Executive Law, the following are actions that the State Education Department (Department) has taken, or will be taking, to implement the recommendations contained in the Office of the State Comptroller's (OSC) Final Audit Report (2014-S-48) entitled *Selected Aspects of the Migrant Education Program*.

Recommendation 1:

Take steps to expedite the Service Delivery Plan update, and complete future programmatic updates in a timely fashion.

The Department has taken and will be taking steps, as outlined below, to revise and update the Service Delivery Plan (SDP) in consultation with key stakeholders, including students, parents, and Migrant Educators. The SDP will reflect changes in the State's strategies and programs based on the completed Comprehensive Needs Assessment. The key activities leading to full implementation are:

Recommendation 2:

Develop methods to periodically provide evaluation results at both the METS level and Program-wide to monitor performance against established goals.

The Department has taken and will be taking steps, as outlined below, to develop strategies, protocols, and instruments to measure the effectiveness of programs and services implemented by the nine regional Migrant Education Tutorial and Support Services Programs (METS) and the three Migrant Statewide Support Services Programs based on established State Performance Targets (SPTs), Measurable Performance Objectives (MPOs), and Performance Indicators (PIs). The key activities leading to full implementation are:

 Review data to determine the validity, reliability, and effectiveness of strategies, protocols, and instruments for monitoring and evaluation of METS and Statewide Programs Finalize strategies, protocols, and instruments for monitoring and evaluation of METS and Statewide Programs Develop schedule for monitoring and evaluation of METS and Statewide Programs 	February 2016
 Conduct formal onsite monitoring visits of METS and Statewide Programs 	March-June 2016
 Conduct formal evaluation of METS and Statewide Programs based on the Annual Performance Report, the Annual Work Plan, and the monitoring reports (where applicable) 	July-August 2016

Recommendation 3:

Establish a method to facilitate the timely exchange of information between METS and school districts.

The Department has taken and will be taking steps, as outlined below, to build instructional data systems that measure student success, provide information to educators of migrant students, and ensure the timely exchange of information among the nine regional Migrant Education Tutorial and Support Services Programs (METS), three Migrant Statewide

Support Services Programs, Department, and school districts. The key activities leading to full implementation are:

 Develop a communications plan and protocols to elicit support from school districts in providing student-level data to the individual METS, to the extent practicable 	September 2015
 Submit an internal data request to the Office of Information and Reporting Services (IRS) 	August 2015
 Develop addenda, in consultation with IRS and the Office of Counsel, to existing contracts with the METS and new three- year Memoranda of Understanding with the Statewide Programs beginning program year 2016-17 	September 2015
 Align current data collected to the finalized State Performance Targets, Measurable Performance Objectives, Performance Index baseline measures, data collection protocols and timeline, and the Evaluation Plan for the proposed Service Delivery Plan 	October 2015
Develop internal controls to ensure student-level data is only available to Migrant Educators who require it, and that students receiving services are migrant-eligible	July 2016
